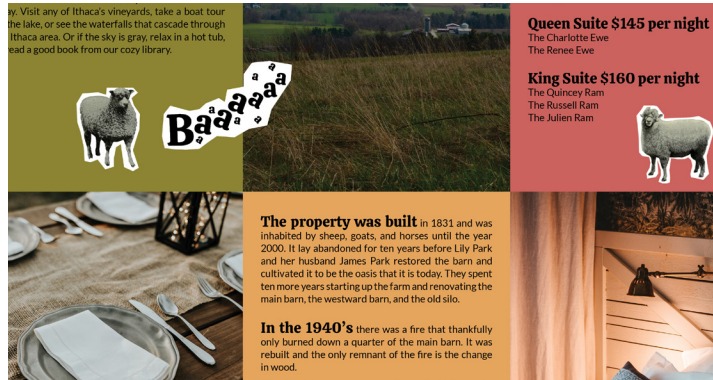
This is a brand package for a boutique hotel salvaged from an old barn. The package includes moodboards, color palettes, logos, a menu, and a brochure.

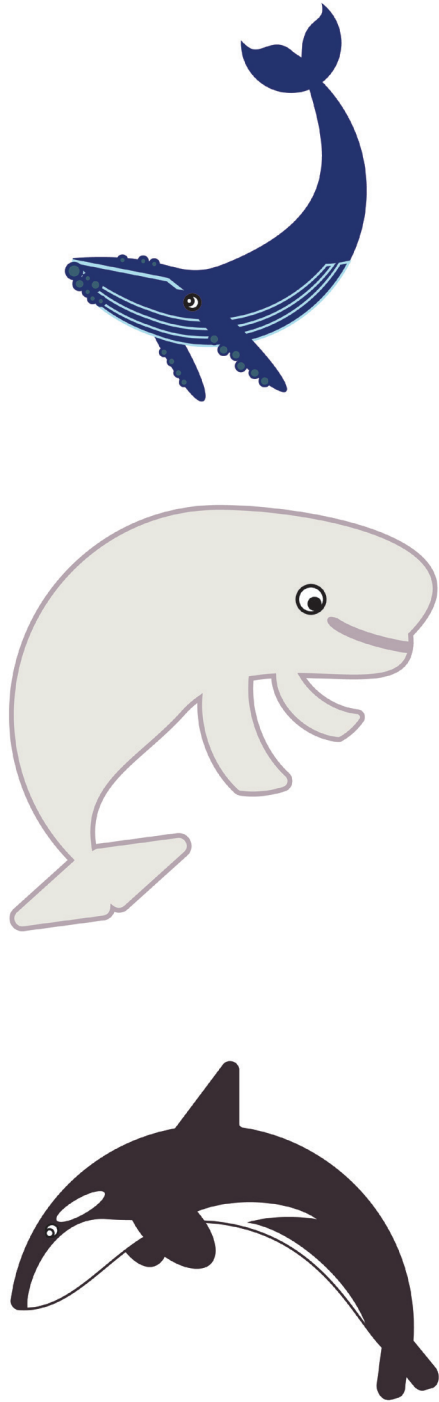
Whale Themed Icons

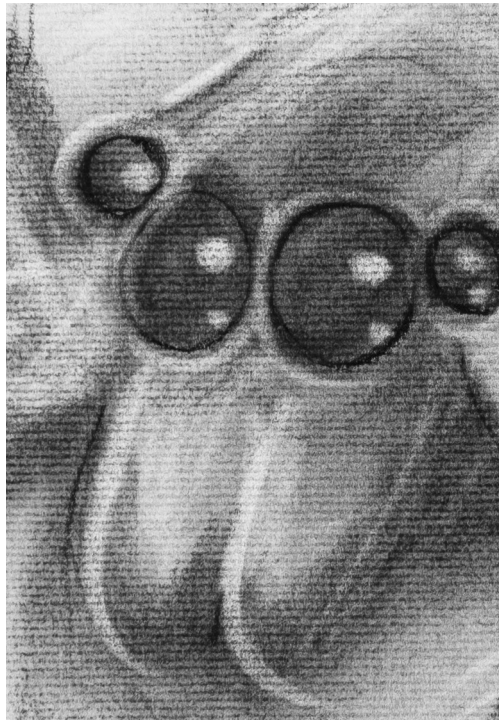

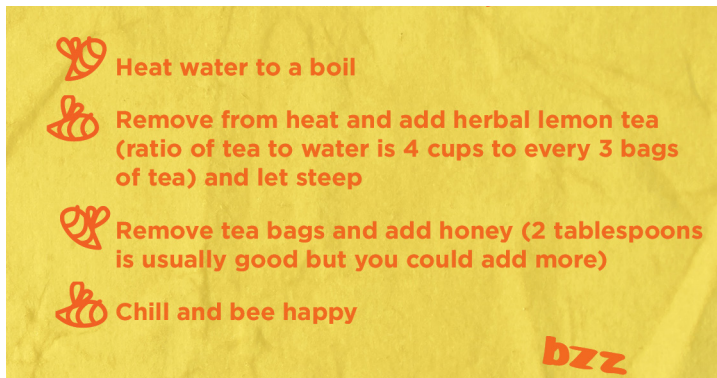
